


Construction started on new campus

July 2015

The new Sylvain campus property is starting to take shape, as in July, the master plan for the first phase was finalized. From July 9 through July 19, architect Dean Van Roekel of Sioux City, IA, was in Haiti working with staff on the building plans. What a blessing to be able to use Dean's 40+ years of experience for this project!

The first phase of the land focuses on the three foundational core elements of MH4H work: education, spiritual equipping, and agriculture. The clean water deep well is completed, with capacity of 32 gallons per minute! We've also planted 1,300 plantain trees and peanuts all along the parameter. Ground was broken for the equipping center this week and the agricultural training center should be completed over the next month.

Please continue to pray for our God-given vision and that we may stay true to His call as we serve the people in the Central Plateau of Haiti. We are all excited about seeing God put the pieces in place for this new chapter of the ministry.


Many Hands Market

Sponsor impact: opening doors for students

During the 18 days, I have interacted with the Savanette schools where our sponsored children attend and have seen the food for our feeding program prepared and served in all three schools. I've spoken to our Thrive families as they gathered in Pignon to pick up their monthly food distribution. These life-giving gifts are reaching children and families. I celebrate the gifts of education, food, medical support, and spiritual development given through sponsorship. Thank you, sponsors, for being a door of love for Christ to walk through!

As I watched sponsorship in action, I realized this gift stretches beyond the child you support. Families in this community struggle to pay the school fees on time, putting great financial pressure on the administration to keep the school open. We have come across several stories of schools closing because they were unable to provide the resources needed to run programming. In June, we paid the full-year school registration for all of our students in all three schools. This gives money at the beginning of the year, increasing the stability and cash flow for the school. By supporting your student and paying on time, this provides continued access to education to the other students who are struggling to pay.

It was a joy to see our children thriving and learning during our visits to the schools. Administration answered questions and gave feedback about student performance. We looked at report cards and discussed the success of the students we sponsor. I left with confidence that these principals have the best interests of our children at heart and understand the responsibility that comes with their position.

I also want to take a moment to celebrate Woody Cadet, our Manager for Education Programs. Working alongside him for weeks brings an appreciation and awareness of his gifts and heart. Managing 100+ families is hard work. Woody covers many details and gives time to every family that needs help. Every time we entered Savanette and Sylvain, the children and the families lit up and warmly embraced him. He has been a pillar of consistency and humble service for MH4H.

It is humbling to see how the sponsorships bless each child and family. As I see the children's faces and speak to the families and school staff, I can say what we are doing is working. The next generation is being given tools to break through repeated generational cycles of poverty and hopelessness. Truly, heaven touches earth and the Kingdom is brought to Haiti.
